#### **10. Discuss and Consider Approval of SIMHC Access Center Services MOU**

The Southern Iowa Mental Health Center (SIMHC) Access Center Services Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) was reviewed via overhead projector. SIMHC has developed all services required to be an access center. All mental health and disability services regions must meet the requirement for an access center by July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2021. The MOU is between SIEL, South Central Behavioral Health and CROSS Regions to agree on operation and cost for the access center services provided. This is not an official designation of an access center by the regions. This is a six-month MOU, with the option to continue for another six-months, to give the access center and regions time to work out logistic issues and demonstrate collaboration between the three regions.

#### **11. Discuss posting of SEIL application for Cares Act funds**

The documents were reviewed via overhead projector. There is a cover letter, application, guidelines for proposal, supplementary information of frequently asked questions from the federal government and the original letter issuing funds to the region from the Department of Human Services. This relates to the Cares Act funds that have been previously discussed. A grant for up to \$20,000.00 may be requested, this is primarily for SEIL mental health contracted providers and public and private schools in the SEIL Region. Other entities are eligible to apply. SEIL wants to use all the funds available for citizens of the SEIL Region and not have to return funds to the state.

There is a project to purchase technology for crisis services providers to improve connectivity among the providers, increase access to providers and provide for continuity of care which lessens the potential of a traumatic experience and includes using HIPAA compliant software. The management team will be learning more about what the monetary value is for the project which is in addition to the grant requests related to the Cares Act funds.
